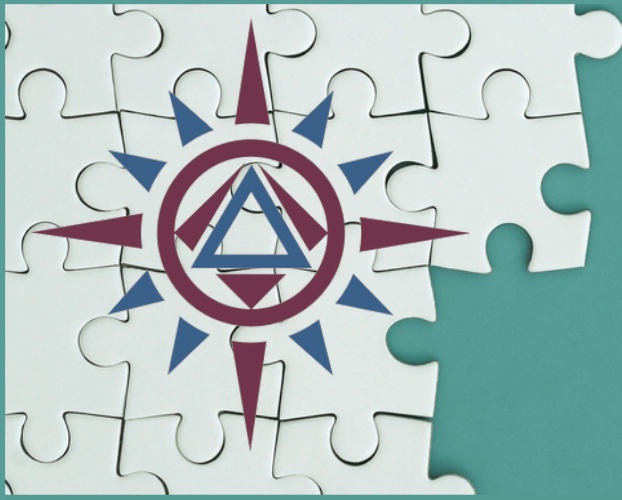

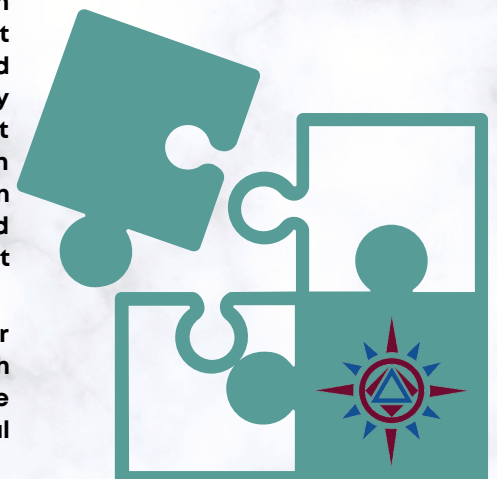

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I define connection as the energy that exists between people when they feel seen, heard, and valued; when they can give and receive without judgment; and when they derive sustenance and strength from the relationship

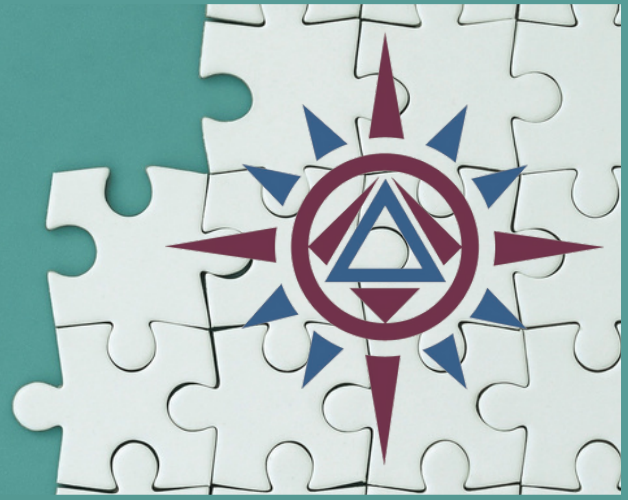

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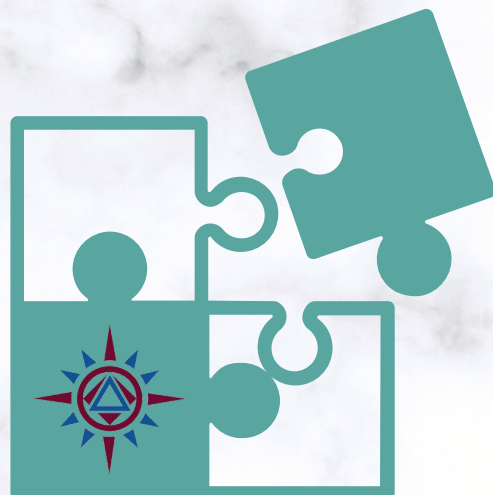

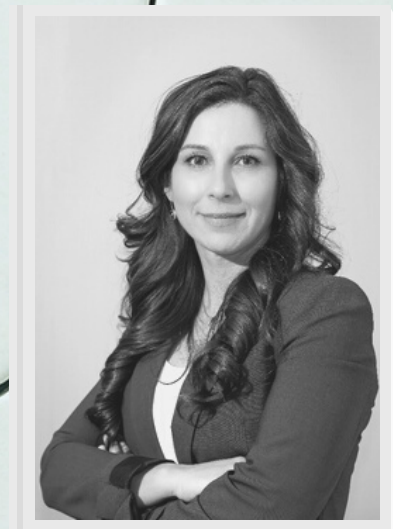
With Dr. Thurston's departure we welcomed our newest addition to the Board and we are pleased to introduce:

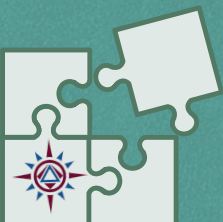

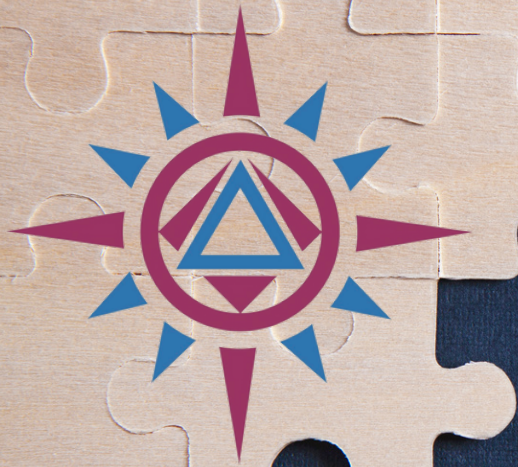

To all our clients, alumni, staff, board, community partners, donors, supporters and friends

I have said from day one that I am not Fresh Start, YOU are Fresh Start. My heart is filled with gratitude for each and every one of you. One of my life's greatest blessings has been getting to work with you and serve those we do. We have built so much together and Fresh Start continues to grow and expand to meet the need in our community as we approach 30 years in 2022.

I know that Fresh Start is in a great place, positioned to move ahead and continue to succeed in serving those in need of recovery. Fresh Start is in good hands with an incredible staff, board, alumni and all of you supporting the way you do.

I am excited for our Fresh Start team and the possibilities that exist for them in their careers. LETHBRIDGE 1 YEAR LATER

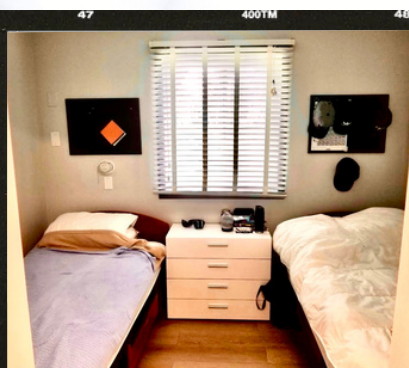
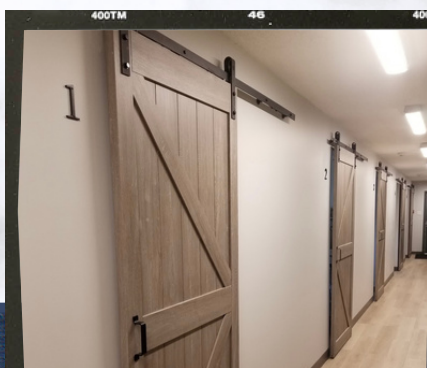
Lethbridge added many new pieces for us in 2021. Over the last year, we have worked towards transformation inside and out, much like recovery. This renewal included renovations to the facility's exterior: new siding, roof, stairs and the addition of two auxiliary buildings. The facility sits just outside the city and is on a large open lot. During the summer, the clients enjoy walks on the seven-acre property and volleyball games on the outdoor courts taking full advantage of the beautiful countryside space. Inside we shifted from an original configuration of 19 men's and four women's beds to now accommodate 13 men and ten women. The original open style dorm accommodations were transformed into semi-private rooms with two beds in each room giving clients more privacy. We have a new community partner who is providing a post-treatment housing option, for six alumni to live in a supported housing environment in Lethbridge.

The transformation for our Lethbridge clients has been remarkable. We have seen the impact Fresh Start programming has made in their lives. By using the tools, they have learned to strengthen their mental, spiritual, emotional and physical well-being. They continue to return to the facility as Alumni to connect with their Outreach Counsellors and new clients to share their experience.

We have recognized our first alumni with one year of continuous sobriety and celebrated this milestone with them. Gratitude tiles have begun to adorn the facility walls and alumni continue to build strong relationships and act as our ambassadors in the community. The atmosphere is electric and the staff has embraced change becoming unified members of our team. We have been working hand in hand in making this an exciting time to be a part of Fresh Start. Online access to Gratitude ceremonies, has made it much easier to tune into the celebrations together, increasing the solidarity of Fresh Start.

With frequent staff meetings, improved communications and travelled roads the distance between the centres is getting shorter. Continuity and transfer of knowledge of our program and operations have been vital to the success of our acquisition. Success can be attributed to our outstanding administrative teams at both facilities. We are a team that demonstrates a willingness to contribute and make efforts so that we grow stronger together.

Thank you to the staff, clients, alumni and community partners for coming together over this past year to make this transition such a remarkable success!





POWER HOUR

2021 saw us move through COVID and back into in-person sessions. It also saw the addition of Lethbridge to Power Hour via video. It has been interesting to observe some gentle competition develop between the two locations. As the Power Hour program has evolved it has incorporated a comprehensive movement sequence that acts as a warm-up and progressive starting point for all participants, regardless of their current fitness level. We have continued to integrate scalable exercise that accounts for most fitness levels and abilities. Breathwork and embodiment practice were incorporated into the programming to increase the capacity and capability to self-regulate and manage intense physical sensations. Programming also included conversations around consistency/balance in exercise versus intensity and interaction and education in nutrition, sleep, mobility and relaxation/rest. Many participants received individualized programming and education around their specific injury rehabilitation programs. There has been an increased level of engagement and participation as the year has progressed. Having some laughs and fun while beginning to enjoy movement and experiencing the body has made the physical discomfort somehow more tolerable! 2022 will see continued focus on making Power Hour more effective and enjoyable for all participants! We operate with two head chefs, one in Calgary and one in Lethbridge who, with the help of their excellent staff, plan and execute 6,570 meals every month. They balance the nutritional needs of every individual resident while adhering to our budgetary requirements. We are constantly sourcing out new partners and always welcome help from the community.

The physical needs of the clients are a top priority for Fresh Start Recovery and some of this cannot be accomplished without help. We have had excellent organizations step up during the year, helping meet the needs of those we serve, including visits to the facility and some mobile solutions. Between Evolution Eyes doing exams on clients and staff, the Dental bus checking dental health, the parking lots seemed to always have something going on.

Our chosen pharmacies, Cedarbrae Pharmacy in Calgary and Stafford Pharmacy in Lethbridge went beyond in helping with COVID testing, allowing us to have visitors at Birthdays, Gratitudes and Alumni meetings safely while continuously ensuring all clients had the required medications.

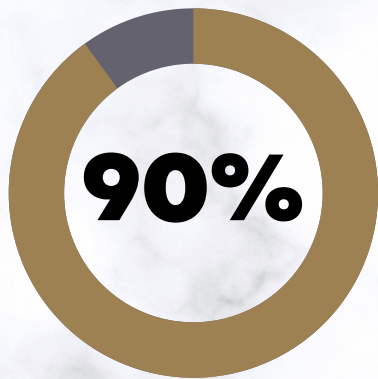
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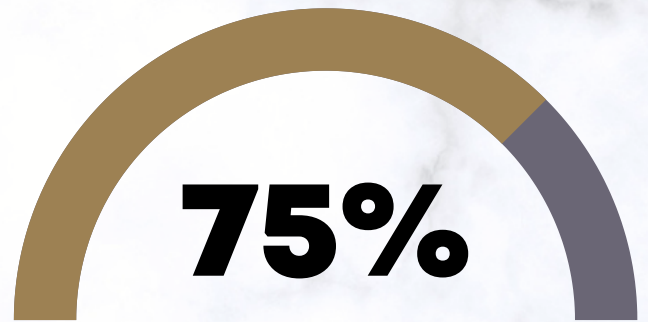

OKI NIKSOKOAKS, NIISTOO NIITANIKO PONAKOH’KOMII

“Hello, my friends, my name is Elk Caller, and my Legal name is Dasan Crowshoe. I come from the Kainai and Aputsii Piikani Nations. My clan is the Lone Fighters. I came to Fresh Start Recovery Center in April of 2020 and remained in the post-treatment housing right up until today. My clean date is April 20th, 2020, and I just took my two years clean a few weeks ago. Thank you for the opportunity to share my experiences while at Fresh Start. Before I came to Fresh Start, I was lost, homeless, using hard drugs daily, hopeless and did not have the power to stop using on my own. When I arrived at Fresh Start, I was welcomed by everyone from staff to current clients and alumni; everyone told me, “Welcome Home.” This, coupled with the atmosphere of recovery, gave me hope that I could recover and start the process of being a whole person again. I was encouraged to make goals for myself that included reconnecting with my spirituality. My earliest memories growing up were sitting in a tipi playing with the other children. At that time, I did not understand what was going on or what was happening.

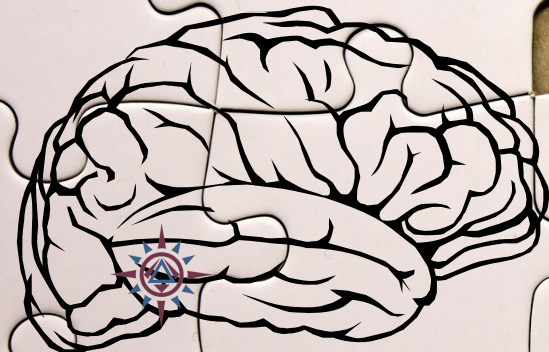
After coming to Fresh Start, I learned that what I was attending when I was a young boy was a bundle opening; after being told this, I realized what was missing in my life. During my time in group, I was encouraged to expand and investigate my Indigenous spirituality and started with that first memory of playing in the tipi. Shortly after my Gratitude Ceremony, where I completed the First Phase of the Fresh Start program, I continued my spiritual journey. I joined one of our Blackfoot Holy Societies. If I did not have my humble beginning at Fresh Start, I would not now be the man I am. My loving family, my healthy and happy 4-year-old son, and my connection to my partner. And that help and inspiration to my community that I offer would not have been possible without Fresh Start Recovery. Ok Kamotanii Misamiipaitipyssinii, there is no English translation for this. Still, it encompasses all the good and every good thing that comes into our lives”. - **Dasan C**

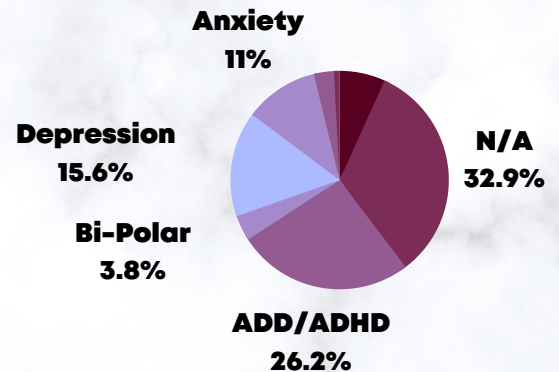
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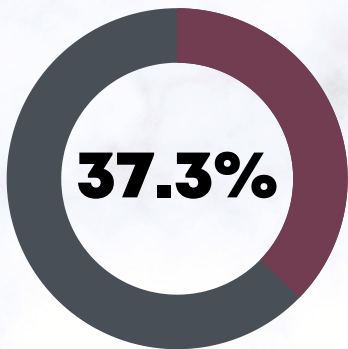
The pandemic has been taxing on everyone mentally and the lack of connection within the recovery community has been especially difficult. 2021 gave us some glimpses of prior days and then quickly they were replaced with distance once again. Fresh Start Staff and Alumni have worked extremely hard to keep the connection inside the houses and in the community throughout the year.



67% of clients were diagnosed with a mental health concern or a psychiatric condition prior to attending Fresh Start.



49% of clients we served in 2021 disclosed they suffered past abuse.



37% reported they had been hospitalized at some point for psychiatric care.

OUR INCREDIBLE STAFF

2021 challenged everyone’s mental well-being, with many variables and constant change. We commend the Fresh Start Recovery Staff for enduring and pushing through so many lockdowns, quarantines and uncertainties over the past year. Our staff has been on the front line during the entire pandemic. All staff had to adjust their day-to-day activities for their safety and that of our clients. Everyone faced ongoing changes head-on with a positive attitude and smile and did what needed to be done. There were changes to meditation, mealtimes, exercise and the overall program for the individuals going through group to ensure that clients remained safe. The work and efforts of all was admirable and the energy with which the staff handled the ever-evolving situation was commendable.

In a 24-hr rotation, no staff was free from the impact felt from the speed of which one had to adapt to the newest circumstances. DALE'S WALK

"The countless kilometers of dirt roads that were walked from Edmonton to Calgary was the most mentally and physically exhausting challenge I've ever willingly chosen to do. As amazing of an experience, I firmly believe that the many months before the walk was where the real foundation of mental strength was laid."

It was January of 2019. Weighing well over 235lbs, I decided to go out for a run in the middle of Winter while wearing just a hoodie, pyjama pants and lace-less slip-on shoes. I chose to wait until after dark, and the streets were quiet because I'd be lucky to make it even one block before being out of breath and wanting to stop and have a cigarette.

Weeks passed, one block turned into two, two blocks turned into three, and running one kilometre was a daily routine before I knew it. After five months of running, I shed 60 pounds - not understanding that this was the slightest change. What I overlooked was that my mentality had changed. I was motivated to succeed and had formed integrity and commitment that I didn't know existed. Most importantly, I found that my mind had become stronger than the drugs ever were. I continuously wanted to conquer challenges that were nothing more than a laughable dream a few months prior." - **Dale S**

Dale arrived at Fresh Start in Calgary with bandages on his feet and a massive smile on his face. When we asked him how he accomplished his goal, he said he did it "one step at a time." The clients and staff greeted Dale with cheers and a couple of buckets of ice water to cool down those tired feet. The strenuous walk took a physical toll on Dale, but his smile showed the extraordinary mental fortitude it took to complete this epic walk. Dale helped raise awareness for addiction recovery and raised over \$5,600 to help more men, women, and families.

It is an inspiring time to be a part of Fresh Start, and we cannot wait to see what the Alumni have in store for 2022.

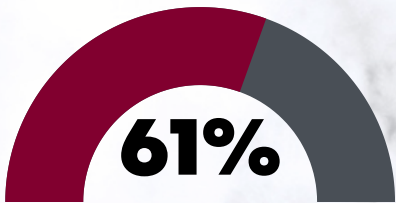

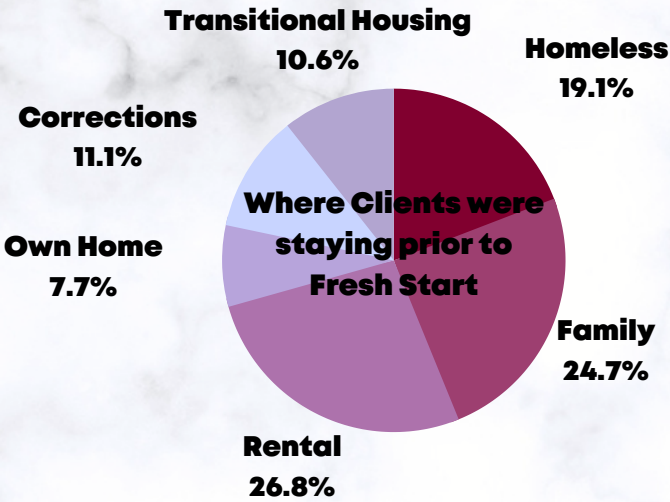
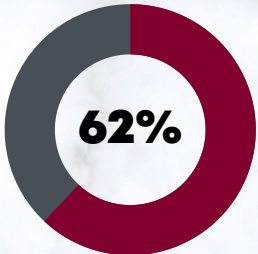

RECONNECTING FAMILIES



Gerald and Amber's story is a special one - we have been able to watch two journeys in recovery come together and unite right before our eyes. Gerald entered treatment at our facility in Calgary five short days after his girlfriend Amber started group in Lethbridge.

Prior to entering our facilities, both had endured many hardships including health issues and losing custody of their child to foster care due to their ongoing substance misuse. Before being admitted into Fresh Start they finished detox and were living in their vehicle, calling the front desk daily to check in on the waitlist. They found our facility through exhaustive online searches and were ready to live a better life and work towards getting their daughter back. While the separation was not easy for them over the 3 months they were in treatment, Amber was able to make it up to Calgary to see Gerald and their daughter for weekly visits. Both Gerald and Amber immersed themselves in the culture of gratitude at Fresh Start, getting active in their programs, 12 step fellowships and community with the other clients. It was beautiful to see their daughter present at both of their Gratuities in Calgary and Lethbridge and to witness their pride of accomplishment.

One of the greatest benefits of being in recovery is the capacity to deal with the other issues that we may have ignored while in active addiction. Gerald has been dealing with a heart condition; thankfully, after gaining clarity and the ability to focus on health, his condition is now being managed. He is working full time and continues to attend meetings and come back to the house as often as possible. Amber has been focusing on her career choices and attending programs to further help her navigate the road ahead. Both now live in our post treatment housing and have been actively working on themselves to be present for each other, better parents and back into the stream of life.

They are in the process of getting their daughter back into their care and are working towards full custody. They are happy to announce they are pregnant with their second child together. Congratulations to you both we wish you much success in your journey ahead.



BUILDING BRIDGES IN RECOVERY

Family Healing Program

FAMILY HEALING

With the Family Healing Program needing to move to a strictly online platform this past year due to the COVID restrictions we missed the connection that the in-person

program offers. Although offering the program online has extended our reach across Canada and in to the United States, we have still felt the emotional disconnect and the positive effects that a physical presence brings. It seems obvious that the individual dealing with substance misuse needs help addressing their challenges and struggles associated with the disease in order to heal. However, we are also mindful that for recovery to be successful family and friends should also seek the healing they need and deserve. Too often family members and friends of those struggling with addiction believe that they are somehow at fault. Addiction is a family disease that affects everyone differently. It is our belief that when family and friends along with the person experiencing addiction all receive the help and healing through learning, love and support, it empowers everyone to move toward a solution rather than continuing to live in the circular nature of the problem.

The Family Healing Program was made possible with the generous support of people like you. With your help, this program continues to grow and benefit those who have been or continue to be affected by someone else's addiction. The Family Healing Program helps family and friends to gain a new perspective and gives them the tools to understand how their loved one's addiction affects them personally and the importance of finding peace within themselves first before being able to better support their loved one. It provides freedom from the debilitating effects of the disease of addiction and it creates a space to reset relationships with healthier, clear boundaries and insight of how to communicate more effectively. The Family Healing Program helps family and friends learn how to live their recovery, cope with the challenges and emotions of the journey and regain their own voice. Family members and friends come to us often feeling frustrated, hopeless and unsure of what to do next. Those who participate in the program sessions express feelings of gratitude, better understanding and how the program taught them to unhook from the disease. The Family Healing Program challenges participants to see the role they have been playing in the person's life. With new understanding, the dynamics in the relationship between friends, family and their loved ones in addiction, change for the better.

THE FAMILY VIEW

“The Family Healing Program & Alumni is a way for us to connect with family members of addicts. We were able to start our healing journey through a five-week intensive course, followed by becoming an Alumni member. We attend weekly meetings with fellow alumni, whether in person or via Zoom. Here we are able to start or continue with the healing process of recovery for the family. Whether you are new to the group or have been with it for a longer time, members of our group share experiences on their road to helping heal and continue the vision of Fresh Start. Primarily, it is a support group for family members of addicts. We read 12-step literature but have no affiliation with Al-Anon. Everyone in the group has a platform to share their experiences, free from any judgement from group members. We share our path to recovery. For us, this has been a great vehicle to start the healing process and a place to communicate what we are going through with other members who have similar struggles. It is a wonderful program that we would recommend to anyone with these struggles and issues. OUTREACH

The Outreach Department at Fresh Start Recovery continues to support clients after they move on from the facility and complete treatment providing the necessary tools and support, continuing to build on the foundation provided in Fresh Start. Clients leaving formal treatment often face destabilization in significant life areas. Outreach helps clients in some of the following areas: employment support, financial support, legal support, family relationships, social relationships and recovery supports through ongoing recovery coaching. A four-week relapse prevention group is facilitated in Fresh Start's main facilities for those who seek more in their journey.

Successfully completing treatment at Fresh Start is not the finish line and the work does not stop there. Moving away from substance abuse is one thing but living a life filled with happiness, hope and continued sobriety takes ongoing work and strong support system. . And, in order to achieve long term recovery an addict must seek emotional sobriety - being capable of embracing all of one's feelings no longer needing to turn to drugs and alcohol to escape our emotions. An emotionally sober person has taken time to develop a deep inner strength. Our Outreach Team is there to support our clients on their path to emotional sobriety.

The work of the Fresh Start Outreach Department increases the likelihood for positive outcomes for clients leaving residential treatment. By creating a supportive environment where clients can work through challenges commonly faced by those with substance abuse disorder, we provide the greatest chance for success. Fresh Start is eternally grateful to those who provide financial support to the Outreach Department which relies solely on donations for its operations. PLANTING A SEED

"Bruce Oake is a beautiful, 43,000 square foot state-of-the-art Recovery Centre in the west end of Winnipeg. It is named after our first-born son Bruce who lost his battle with addiction in 2011 and modelled after Fresh Start Recovery Centre. We are proud of our success but ever mindful that it would not be possible without the ongoing guidance and support of Fresh Start. We consider Bruce Oake to be an unofficial division of Fresh Start".

When Bruce died, my late wife Anne, Darcy (Bruce's younger brother), and I decided to give voice to our grief. Bruce had had some success in long-term treatment, so we knew what we wanted to do. And that was to establish a centre that went far beyond 21- and 45-day programs that offered a continuum of care and didn't discriminate based on ability to pay. It was a lofty goal, and we had no idea how to make it happen. Anne and I spoke at countless events for a few years and managed to raise some money. But we were neutral, with the end goal becoming even more distant. We needed a boost. And then one day... providence! The journey has been long. I believe it to be the fall of 2015 when Lisa Simone, then Fresh Start's National Communications Director, passed through Winnipeg on her way to Ontario. One of our supporters knew her and set up a meeting at a coffee shop. That meeting changed everything.

Lisa proposed the support of Fresh Start and introduced us to Stacey and Bruce. Through many conference calls and meetings from Calgary to Winnipeg and vice versa. This resulted in the unconditional support Fresh Start offered us in finding our path. Also, ensuring we would not become that well-intentioned group of citizens who might be able to get a place built but then what?

Major donors and the Government began listening more intently when we told them how we intended to run Bruce Oake following Fresh Start's successful program. Anne and I never met with a prospective major donor who said no. We always came away with something, and Fresh Start had a lot to do with that.

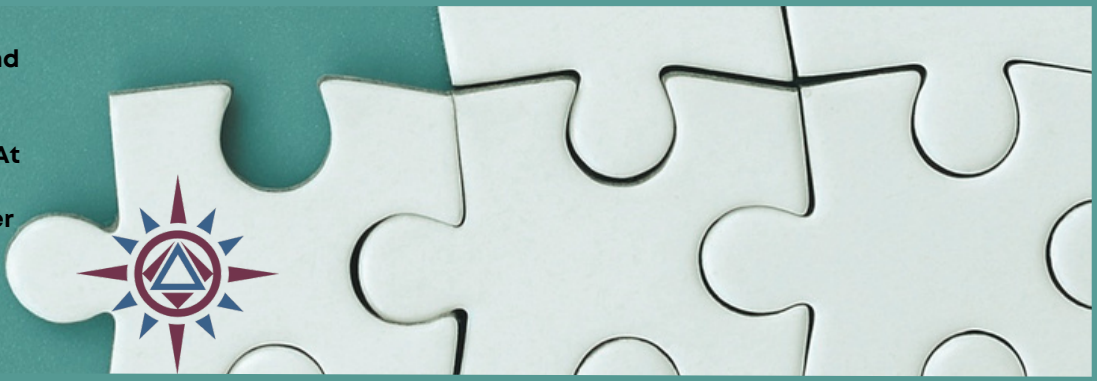

RESILIENCE

The word resilience is commonly used in our field in reference to trauma and substance use and has become somewhat the “word of the day”. Resilience is so much more than a catchphrase; it’s importance should not be understated. Resilience is the capacity that one has to recover from difficulties and adjust to change. To recognize and mobilize clusters of strength and use them to overcome hardship and adversity. Through the Fresh Start treatment program individuals build resiliency and learn coping mechanisms to handle difficult circumstances and emotions without turning to drugs and alcohol. Resiliency motivates people to enter the doors of Fresh Start and take that first step propelling them towards recovery.

Usually, when someone who lives with the disease of addiction decides to seek help, they are sick, defeated and broken – the word resilience is not at the forefront of their mind. It is important to remember the strength that it takes for many to survive hardships, difficult upbringing and family circumstances, traumatic childhood or adult experiences and the courage it takes to ask or accept help after surviving adversity. When these folks allow us to walk alongside them on their recovery journey, it is essential to empower and build on the abilities and skills they already possess but may not even know they have.

Many transferable skills can be taken from surviving trauma and the disease of addiction. However, the tricky part is to hone these, so the person is not just trying to survive but can begin to experience life free from drugs and/or alcohol. Historically, humans are tribal beings and excel when they are supported as part of a community. Unfortunately, many people do not receive the support, guidance, or connection in their families of origin. They ultimately recreate the same patterns or behaviours they are trying to escape. Instead of shaming and punishing these souls, they need to be cared for, loved and encouraged until they recognize the strength and ability within them. Only when a person can practice skills in a safe, supported and structured environment can they begin to gain independence and start giving back to their families and communities.

By living life successfully and having the opportunity to serve and help those who also struggle, resilience becomes more than just a word. It transforms into an inherent belief. A belief that Fresh Start has chosen to practice, embody and share with every individual we serve.

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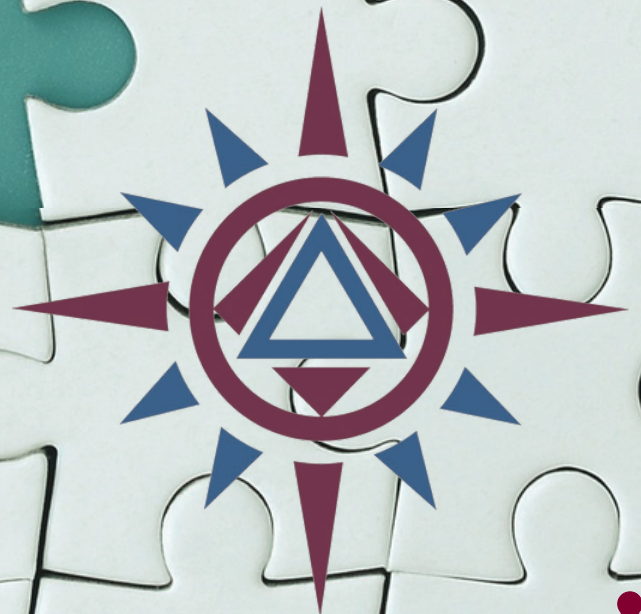

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Directors of Fresh Start Recovery Centre

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Fresh Start Recovery Centre (the Centre), which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2021, and the statements of revenues and expenditures, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Centre as at December 31, 2021, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with many not-for-profit organizations, the Centre derives revenue from fundraising activities the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Centre. Therefore, we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to fundraising and donations revenue, excess of revenues over expenses, and cash flows from operations for the year ended December 31, 2021, current assets and net assets as at December 31, 2021. Our audit opinion on the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2020 was modified accordingly because of the possible effects of this limitation of scope.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Centre in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with those requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Centre's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters relating to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Centre or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Centre's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements. As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Centre's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Centre's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Centre to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

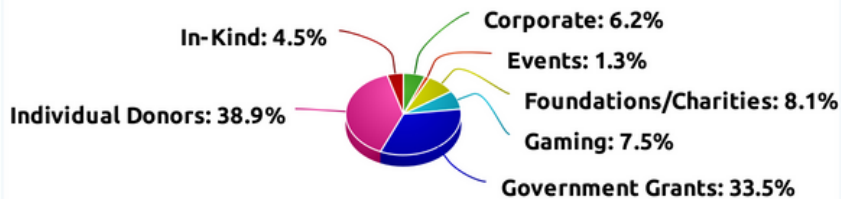
