Acknowledgement

We acknowledge that we are on traditional territories in Alberta of many First Nations, Métis, and Inuit whose footsteps have marked these lands for centuries and who have lived on and cared for these lands for generations. Who We Are



Fresh Start Recovery is an accredited and recognized organization in Calgary and Lethbridge. We provide 123 treatment beds and 112 post-treatment beds to individuals seeking recovery. We are not just a treatment centre but a source of knowledge and understanding. We understand that addiction is a chronic brain disorder, and this understanding allows us to employ an interdisciplinary client-centred approach to treatment, reassuring our stakeholders that we are equipped to provide the best care possible.


Fresh Start Recovery aligns with the philosophy that recovery is restoring an individual's sense of belonging through self-determination and reconnection with others and the community. We utilize a comprehensive goal-setting strategy, building resiliency by developing and exploring interpersonal relationships, spirituality, education, employment, housing, culture, and a further introspective look at oneself. This approach is enhanced through recreational and therapeutic activities in an atmosphere conducive to physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual growth. Our use of peer support runs in unison with our treatment program, derived from the 12-step abstinence-based approach to recovery and underpinned by a biopsychosocial-spiritual model that is further enhanced through community partnerships and relationships.

Our staffing model is exceptionally diverse and eclectic. Over 300 years of combined lived and shared experience among our employees allow us to bring forth an empirically based approach to treatment, reinforced with varying degrees of academic recognition. Our insight, compassion, and understanding of recovery allow us to provide our clients with the means to engage with and become part of a larger recovery community.

We are committed to developing and implementing strategies and best practices that provide solutions for treating addiction and substance abuse.



"Welcome home. You are no longer alone."


We understand the importance of community, and with your help, we have created spaces that resonate with the feeling of comfort, security and a sense of what home could be like. Every attempt is made to create a welcoming experience to assist in nurturing the journey toward recovery. Our spaces are more than just physical locations; this is where healing begins and continues as growth is fostered and new foundations are laid.

We recognize the importance of cultivating a sense of community and belonging, an experience critical for those stepping into a new chapter of life. From our treatment centers to our post-treatment housing, we seek to provide an environment that offers a sense of safety, acceptance, and encouragement. Together, through your commitment, support and investment, we continue to be empowered to create and develop spaces that speak directly to the well-being of our clients, their families, and those we have yet to serve. Echoing the message read when ascending our steps – welcome home, you are no longer alone!

In 2023, Fresh Start Recovery acquired 66 more beds for post-treatment housing, more than doubling its ability to house, treat, and support individuals and their families.



BUILDING BRIDGES TO RECOVERY



Fresh Start Recovery embarked on a significant initiative to expand our post-treatment housing for individuals and families embarking on their journey back to community. This 66-bed, 34-unit expansion was made possible through generous funding from the Government of Alberta, the Calgary Homeless Foundation, and individual donors whose contributions, coupled with Kanas Corp's dedication to our cause, have been foundational in realizing this vision and securing this essential property. This strategic acquisition is a shining example of coming together to address the dire need for supportive housing.

Our successes in Calgary have set remarkable precedents, showcasing what can be achieved collectively. We are continuously fostering partnerships with landlords in Lethbridge to mirror the incredible support received in Calgary. We are grateful to the Lethbridge Housing Authority for their ongoing support in achieving a sense of home in the Lethbridge community for so many in recovery. The path to recovery requires more than just initial treatment; it necessitates sustainable, affordable housing solutions that support individuals and families as they weave their way through the intricate process of reintegration into the community.

Community support is required to achieve this sense of home. Together, we will make a tangible difference to those in recovery. Our initiative is more than a project; it's a call to action for everyone to contribute to a cause that affects us all. Ongoing support is pivotal, ensuring that every step toward recovery is met with the support and resources needed for success.

In 2023, Fresh Start Recovery helped over 200 clients access educational development, vocational, and employment training to successfully re-enter the workforce and embark on new career paths with confidence and the necessary skills.



TREATING

Fresh Start Recovery has long embraced the principles of a recovery-oriented system of care and a holistic approach to addiction treatment. This approach has been enriched over the years through strategic partnerships with the Government of Alberta, the Northwest Territories Government, Correctional Service Canada and numerous Community Partners and Supporters, underpinning a comprehensive treatment framework. Our approach involves client-focused treatment plans while delivering programs that blend innovative treatment methods with wellness practices to empower individuals on their recovery journey. We recognize each challenge as an opportunity for personal growth and to provide support and guidance reinforced by the strength of our community, facilitating pathways for individuals and families toward a life in recovery. Recovery is intertwined with nurturing each individual's path and a network of care that leads to a future of hope and opportunity.

In 2023, Fresh Start Recovery and the Government of Alberta partnered to open a 50-bed Recovery Community in Lethbridge to support more Albertans on their path to Recovery.



EXPANDING HORIZONS

Fresh Start Recovery unveiled a 50-bed recovery community in Lethbridge in September of 2023, a significant stride made possible through our partnership with the Government of Alberta. This initiative allows us to offer extended support for up to a year, fostering a solid recovery foundation for individuals. The new site augments our treatment services and has become a gathering place for milestone meetings, gratitude ceremonies, 12-step meetings, and events, creating and bringing together a vibrant, supportive community.

The Lethbridge Recovery Community closely aligns with the Fresh Start philosophy, emphasizing holistic, long-term treatment accessible to Albertans battling addiction at no cost. Our comprehensive approach addresses an individual's needs, focusing on regaining physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual wellness.

To ensure consistency and the highest quality of care across our network, our three facilities are aligned, providing uniform services, strengthening our commitment to treatment and providing an individualistic journey.

In 2023, Fresh Start Recovery ensured that clients received access to comprehensive medical assessments and follow-up care by collaborating with physicians and pharmacies, addressing immediate and long-term health needs.



SUPPORTING

COMING TOGETHER

Fresh Start Recovery's Family and Friends -Coming Together Series has embraced its own renewal, broadening its scope to serve an increased audience impacted by addiction. This strategic enhancement, led by skilled facilitators, ensures that anyone affected by addiction, regardless of their geographical location or direct connection to Fresh Start, can benefit from the program.

Addiction has had an extensive impact on families, friends, employers and the community at large, "Coming Together" has evolved into a comprehensive support platform. It's uniquely designed to address the needs of anyone who finds themselves navigating the effects of addiction and recovery in their personal or professional lives. The program covers a wide range of pertinent topics, from the intricacies of addiction and its systemic effects to practical strategies for setting healthy boundaries and engaging in self-care. It is now presented two times a week over four weeks; participants are encouraged to explore these themes through interactive sessions that promote learning, connection, and personal growth.

This expanded series underscores our dedication to creating a supportive and healing environment. It highlights the importance of collective action and mutual support in addressing addiction, aiming to cultivate a well-informed, compassionate, and resilient community. The series supports individuals and their immediate circles and empowers the broader community to engage with and contribute to recovery. The Friends and Family - Coming Together Series invites all community members to come together in recovery.

In 2023, 95% of the individuals completing treatment indicated that staff helped them keep track of their progress and assist them in fulfilling their personal goals.



EVENTS

Each event brings new strength to the vibrant tapestry we call community. They bring us closer by weaving clients, alumni, staff, friends, and family into a tight-knit, eclectic community. These opportunities are pivotal moments of connection and celebration, breaking down the barriers and stigma surrounding addiction. Coming together, sharing space, and telling stories, we honour the diverse faces of recovery, challenging preconceived notions of addiction and fostering a deeper understanding of healing.

Our events are not just occasions but shared moments in the fabric of time for connection, celebration, empathy, and empowerment. We recognize these moments as essential threads in mending life's fabric.

In 2023, 90% of the individuals completing treatment indicated that staff encouraged them to include people important to them in their recovery/treatment planning, such as family, friends, clergy, or an employer.



STRONGER TOGETHER



We sought to strategically strengthen our community through an increased sense of unity and inclusion, notably bridging distances with an expanded approach to activities throughout our community. Initiating a collaborative approach with Aventa was a pivotal step, bringing our alumni together through collaboration on diverse events like pool parties, recovery community dances and other group activities. This partnership did more than unite our communities; it set the stage for broader involvement, inviting the wider recovery community, including staff, clients, and alumni from other treatment centers, enriching our collective experience.

From this spirit of cooperation emerged the Rocky Mountain Recovery Society, the beginning steps into a new collective bringing together a wide range of participating partners interested in engaging, developing and creating community. This collaboration will result in four different events throughout the year, designed to specifically engage the recovery community and the community and to evolve a unified recovery community. The unification in the collaboration of these organizations will result in exponential opportunities in the coming year. These efforts highlight the importance of collective action and a shared purpose in the recovery landscape.

Fresh Start Recovery continued to develop its internal unity through our events, including the 15th Annual 12 Stop Ride for Recovery, which, for the first time, was launched simultaneously in Calgary and Lethbridge. This culminated in shared meals and the excitement of our raffle draws. Alongside our commitment to engagement through quarterly panel discussions, this nurtured a profound sense of unity. These panels were vital platforms for openly sharing recovery challenges and personal journeys, enriching our mutual understanding and reinforcing our interconnectedness.

In 2023, 89% of the individuals attending Fresh Start Recovery indicated they developed a significantly deepened sense of belonging, fostering a community where they felt understood and supported.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Opinion



Fresh Start Funding Sources 2023




